Foreign Athletes:

The Athletes (Juniors and Young Riders and Riders U25 aged 14 to 25 years) will be invited by the organizer through their home NF.

Per foreign NF up to 8 Athletes are authorized to start.

German Athletes:

Each federal association may enter up to 8 German Juniors/Young Riders/Riders U25 (14 - 25 years old) nominated by the respective regional trainer. For the regional federation of Berlin-Brandenburg in addition 6 named individual Athletes are authorized to start.

Up to 8 Athletes who belong to the C cadre or to the „Sportschule der Bundeswehr“ (Sports School of the Federal Army) and who are nominated by the federal trainer jumping for Juniors and Young Riders.

All Athletes:

Per Athlete 3 horses permitted.

One groom per Athlete.

In addition, 20 % of all CSIU25 A Athletes may receive a personal invitation (wildcard) from the OC.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

### **B) GROOMS**

Athletes must reserve rooms for their grooms themselves on their own account. The organizer provides the grooms with free meal vouchers. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the organizer.

### **C) HORSES**

Horses are stabled in boxes (stable tent) from 29<sup>th</sup> June to 3<sup>rd</sup> July, 2011. Stabling fee is included in the entry fee. First bedding (straw) will be free of charge; shavings have to be ordered and paid separately (additional fee € 30,- per box). For horses additionally brought to the event or tack boxes a fee of € 100 (incl. VAT) per box will be charged.

Hay/straw can be bought at the prices of the day on the show grounds.

Mangers and buckets have to be brought along.

Power supply has to be ordered with the entry; a fee of € 30,- (incl. VAT) per charge will be levied.

There will be no reimbursement of transport charges.

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 25,00 € per horse.

### **2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES**

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

### VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23<sup>rd</sup> edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009, updates effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011:

#### PASSPORTS (ART. 137)

1. Every Horse entered for any Competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in a country other than the country of the Horse's nationality, and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see Article 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, must be registered with the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such Horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all Horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

#### EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016.4)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3\* and CCI4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

## **X. MISCELLANEOUS**

### **1. PROTESTS**

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

### **2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS AND PRIZE-CLASSIFICATION**

Special Prize - for the winners of the Final competitions.

### **3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY**

In principle prize-giving ceremonies will take place directly after the respective competitions in the main arena jumping. The athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> have to attend the prize-giving ceremony, further placed athletes may attend the prize-giving ceremony.

#### **4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY**

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money.

The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

#### **5. INSURANCE**

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

#### **6. LIABILITY**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft or other incidents.

#### **7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury, the Chef d'Equipes and the NF Delegate, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
